The award for South Hetton this year will be £17650

Below is a breakdown of how the funding for 2024/2025 will be spent.

We have been looking at the key indicators:

- Staff knowledge and skills: Increase the confidence, knowledge, and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
- Pupil engagement: Increase the engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity
- School profile: Raise the profile of PE and sport across the school
- Physical activity range: Broaden the range of physical activities and sports for all pupils
- Competitive sport participation: Increase participation in competitive sport

(Silver Level) Providing external coaching, access to festivals, inter school competition and access to the Level 3 school games. Providing access to specialist PE Delivery and CPD to up skill staff and additional coaching hours during and after school.	Cost £7700	Rationale Easington SSP provides staff CPD across the year. This can take the form of courses and also team teaching. The SSP provide a wide range of competition and mass participation events across the year. The school's sporting activity is promoted through their social media accounts. They provide a wide range of different sports to participate and compete in. They provide specialist equipment and coaching.
Subsidy for afterschool clubs to increase participation and target those children who are the least active.	£3500	Subsidy of the afterschool clubs to encourage targeted children to attend and work towards 30 minutes per day of physical activity.
Transport costs to allow our children to travel to external venues to compete in a range of competitions at a range of levels	£4500	With increasing transport costs this allows the school to attend as many events as possible.
Affiliation fee to Peterlee and District Primary Schools FA	£110	This allows the school access to compete at the highest levels of school football in the locality and regionally.
Activities/workshops for National School Sports Week	£1000	Provides new opportunities for children to participate in a range of activities.
Purchase of sports equipment to maintain supply in the PE cupboard and outdoor storage.	£1000	Maintain stocks of PE equipment to provide high quality PE lessons and after schools clubs.

Other ways in which we work towards the key indicators not covered by Sport Premium.

- Children encouraged to Bike and walk to school. High percentage of children do this. Bikeability courses run Y6, Y5 and Y4.
- An introduction to Bikeability is offered in Reception and Y1 to introduce pupils to fundamental balance and coordination skills in preparation for riding a bike.
- Opportunities to be active during breaktimes and breakfast club. Pupil Parliament consulted about improvements to be made to the school yard.
- Opportunities taken to work with coaches, clubs and National Governing Bodies to increase opportunities and sign post children to clubs.
- Annual Sporting awards to keep the profile of school sport high.
- Dedicated committee in the Pupil Parliament to deal with PESSPA.
- Regular updates on School Facebook and School Website.
- Girls football day
- National School Sports Week including our Annual Sports Day
- Part of 'Chance to Shine' initiative to deliver cricket coaching sessions through Durham Cricket.
- Ongoing funding for 'Opening School Facilities Funding'. Late after school clubs now running as part of this scheme.
